

A RAPIDLY GROWING IMPACT

 Laguna Seca Raceway's Economic Impact rose \$220 million in just 5 years, going from \$84.4 million in 2018 to \$304 million in 2023

MAJOR EVENTS & ATTENDANCE

- Major Events Include The Monterey Grand Prix, Moto America, INDYCAR Season Finale (2026), IMSA and Rolex Monterey Motorsports Reunion
- As of 2024, Laguna Seca hosted **300,000 total attendees** across all events. 80% of attendees were not local, and 41% attended multiple events in that year.
- Laguna Seca's event calendar shown growth adding additional events increasing from 5 ('18-'19) to 7-8 ('20-'24) per year

BENEFITS FOR HOSPITALITY

- Data from The 2024 Weathertech Raceway Marketing Research:
- Approx 30% of the year's event attendees stayed in a hotel for the event; Approx 50% of those who stayed at hotels stayed more than two nights.
- Monterey Peninsula Average Daily Rates exceed \$250-\$300/night and top \$1,000 during Car week, pushing visitors to day-trips.
- Salinas' lower ADRs can capture those day-trippers and convert them to overnight guests.
- Salinas has opportunity for **new full-service hotels and dining options** to serve event attendees seeking convenience and amenities.

Positive Outlook: If Future capital investments proceed as planned, regional hospitality demand in Salinas is expected to strengthen further per Friends of Laguna Seca

BIG EVENTS, BIG ECONOMIC IMPACT

- Had a direct and induced economic impact of \$24,803,460
- Major tourism during a week of rodeo events means multiday business for hotels in Salinas, every year, adding \$150k+ in local Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT).

A MAGNET FOR TOURISM AND COMMUNITY

In 2024, The California Salinas Rodeo & Salinas Sports Complex:

- Hosted a total of 100,351 attendees across its major events.
- Over **500 rentals** booked during Rodeo Week
- 300+ were sport-related stays, others were for concerts, business events

OPPORTUNITY FOR GROWTH

- Local hotels reach max capacity, leaving room and demand for new lodging
- Opportunity for mid-tier hotels
- Ideal zone for hospitality & mixed-use development
- Rodeo attendees are largely value-conscious visitors, often seeking more
 affordable lodging options away from the Peninsula, a strong fit for Salinas' mid-tier
 hotel opportunities.


RABOBANK STADIUM

- Built to NCAA regulations, this bowl design stadium can hold up to 5,000 in its stands and hosts over 100 events annually, including football, cheer and regional tournaments
- Based on research, the Salinas Soccer Complex brings over \$4 Million of direct and indirect economic impact, with moderate average visitor spending at about \$330

SOFTBALL EVENTS DRIVE YEAR-ROUND DEMAND

- Hosts 30+ softball tournaments annually, drawing teams statewide
- Events span 2-3 days, with most teams requiring overnight stays
- Tournaments contribute to steady hotel room demand throughout the year

SALINAS REGIONAL SOCCER COMPLEX

The Salinas Regional Soccer Complex highlights the possibilities new development could bring for the Salinas community

- Currently, the SRSC has a total of 14 soccer fields, 2 of them being artificial turf with stadium lights allowing for nighttime play
- SRSC has outlined an impressive **4 phase plan** to expand into the **LARGEST** soccer complex of its kind between San Francisco and LA.
- The Salinas Regional Soccer Complex hosts about 11,500+ visitors per week, adding up to more than 600,000 annually
- Economic impacts conservatively estimate over 45,000 annual out-of-town visitors ranging between \$12.5M \$25M total output annually

ALLIANZA TOURNAMENT IMPACT

- The 2025 Allianza Cup brought 147 teams and 27,484 spectators to Salinas
- Hosted over **250 games in 3 days**, generating substantial visitor traffic
- Considered one of the largest Latino youth soccer tournaments in the US
- Confirmed a multi-year commitment to return through at least 2029
- Tournament organizers praised Salinas for its welcoming community and location

DEMAND FOR NURSES

- California is **short 40,000 RNs** (Projected through 2026)
- Travel Nurses have grown +430% nationwide since 2018
- California leads the nation with 9% of travel nurse openings
- Travel nurses rotate on 13-week assignments, creating constent demand for:
 - Hotels
 - Short-term Rentals
 - Mixed-use housing near hospitals
